Global Strategic Vision

Pray fervently and in faith for the following *Gateway Cities in the 10/40 Window*. Pray to the Lord of the harvest for more laborers, fresh manifestations of the Holy Spirit's power, and transformation and openness to the Gospel in these strategic Gateway cities.

- Northern Africa: Khartoum and Mogadishu
- Middle East: *Damascus* and *Istanbul*
- Central Asia: Calcutta and Jaipur
- Eastern Asia: Beijing and Phnom Penh

Pray fervently for these great cities, supplicating on their behalf before the Lord, asking him to pour out his own dear Holy Spirit upon them, that the Gospel of Messiah Jesus may penetrate every dimension of these societies within each of these influential Gateway cities. Let us entreat the Lord on behalf of these key cities, believing God for his intervention:

Pray for Northern Africa and for the great cities of *Khartoum* and *Mogadishu*. In *Khartoum*, pray for peace and that relief shipments can get to the people–pray that Christian relief agencies can get in. Pray also that workers can train local leaders and that Sudanese Christians will evangelize and disciple new believers to carry on the work of the Gospel, pray for strength to withstand suffering. Pray for Bible translation work to continue, for more translators; for workers in literacy training and for financial resources to rebuild the church. Pray that the people would see how the government is treating non-Muslims and that this would cause them to turn to Christ. In *Mogadishu* pray that the warlords would lose their power and the government would be stabilized, pray that the poor would receive the food and care they need, the streets would be peaceful and safe. Pray for the persecuted underground Somali church; pray that these believers would be discipled into faithful and wise leaders

in the young church, that they would be Christ's warriors bringing his peace. Pray that Christian relief workers can effectively communicate the love of Christ as they distribute food and medicine.

- Pray for an outpouring of God's Holy Spirit within *Damascus* and *Istanbul*, great Middle Eastern cities. In *Damascus* pray Christian TV, radio, Bibles, and literature would have great evangelistic impact and that the Orthodox and Catholic Christians would be born-again, becoming active witnesses for Christ. Pray for laborers to serve in the new slums among the unreached urban poor. Pray for more full-time workers to serve the churches and train new leaders. Pray for the development of Christian radio and TV, distribution of Christian videos, and use of Bible correspondence to learn of Christ in *Istanbul*. Pray that the economic crisis, rise of the fundamentalist Muslim political party, and the city's ancient roots as a religious and political capital would cause many throughout the Muslim world to turn to Christ. Pray for unity and love among the local Turkish fellowships.
- Pray for *Calcutta* and *Jaipur*, powerful Central Asian cities. In *Calcutta*, pray for a Christian witness in the city's slums among the Muslims, pray for the poor as they struggle for daily survival. Pray for strength and resources for Christian relief agencies and a Christian witness among the poor and unreached Muslims. Pray that God's power would be evident to the people living in bondage to the destructive god Kali, pray that the value of human life will be recognized, especially of females. Finally pray for the students studying in the Bible colleges. In *Jaipur* pray that the Muslim Meo people and the higher caste Hindus (the Rajputs, Jats, and Marwari) might become responsive to the gospel. Pray for increased conversions through Christian literature, radio, and correspondence courses. Pray that churches would multiply. Pray against the worship of rats

that produces conditions that foster pneumonic plague, and pray that children would be protected by the laws abolishing early marriage.

Pray for **Beijing** and **Phnom Penh** in Eastern Asia. With its incredible media coverage through the Olympics, Beijing has emerged on the world stage as a central city of worldwide importance. Pray for the safety of the persecuted house church leaders in Beijing. Pray that officials favorable to Christianity will be raised up and that the believers will have discernment about how and to whom they should share the Gospel. Pray that Christians will wisely take advantage of foreign business opportunities that are streaming into Beijing in a way that advances the Kingdom, and pray that disillusioned university intellectuals in their search for truth would discover Christ. Pray for unity among the church leaders in *Phnom Penh*, and that the Lord will raise up more Christian leaders to disciple the harvest, especially youth workers. Pray that God will grant wisdom and finance to Christians who are willing to pioneer practical projects to rebuild the city and the lives of the people, and pray for protection of the body of Christ from materialism, corruption, wrong doctrine, and competition. Pray that these believers would be healed and able to forgive their former enemies who tortured them in prisons.

Intercede on behalf of eight of the inner cities of America, (*Tacoma*, WA; Monmouth-Ocean, NJ; Scranton-Wilkes-Barre-Hazelton, PA; Ventura, CA; Springfield, MA; Lakeland-Winter Haven, FL; Johnson City-Kingsport-Bristol, TN-VA; Honolulu, HI; Chattanooga, TN-GA) that God might bring revival, renewal, and power to the churches in these cities. Pray that the Holy Spirit would fall upon them, transforming them, and that he would ignite fresh movements of vital spirituality and missions through them to reach the neighborhoods which do not know Christ.

- Pray for revival among God's people who live in these cities, that they would renounce all fleshly power and glory, that pastors and Christians within them will rediscover their identity and mission to be the Church of God in their cities, and that they will reflect that in renewed desire for holy living and fresh passion to win the lost around them, and feel the burden of being custodians of God's true Word.

- Above all this month, pray for that the Holy Spirit will transform the churches in these cities, igniting new passion for Christ, new love for the Gospel, and new missional efforts to plant Christ-centered, Bible-based churches in these cities. Pray that God would grant the churches in these cities deep grace to see what is at stake in the telling of the Good News, and that all believers in them would sense the need to share the powerful riches of the truth of God within their particular circles of influence. Pray for a new awareness of God's mandate to make disciples in these cities, and for fresh, vigorous efforts to plant churches among the poor in these cities.

Khartoum (kahr-toom) . Day 5

Meaning: "elephant's trunk'

Country: Sudan* Population: 2,477,000 Poverty: 2.8 million displaced people not officially counted in Sudan's population Religious Breakdown: 70.0% Muslim 11.0% Traditional Religions 16.0% Christian 3.1% Evangelical

Status of the church: Growth among relocated southerners, a few Muslim converts

Major Religious Sites:

Hamed al Niel Mosque El Kabir Mosque, Mahadi's Tomb

City Significance/History:

The spread of Christianity in the early centuries followed trade routes. It remained north of the Sahara Desert and along the Mediterranean Sea, but was able to penetrate into Sudan because of the Nile River.

The White and Blue Nile rivers joined together to make a fertile agricultural zone where life was pleasant and crops grew well. Established nearby was Soba, the capital of the Christian kingdom of Nubia (c. 580), not far from present-day Khartoum. By the 14th century, an active Christian kingdom was almost extinct as Islam grew. During the 19th century Khartoum became an export location for slaves and ivory

The silver-domed mosque and minarets mark this Islamic capital. Islam has been growing in the north of Sudan as Muslim holy men lead the country into *sharia* (Islamic) law. This law is forced on the Muslims and non-Muslims alike.

The famine in the south has caused death and hardship on the non-Muslim peoples. People do seek help in Khartoum but are banished to the harsh southern desert–1 1/2 million have died and over 5 million are internal refugees. Aid sent to Sudan rarely reaches the needy. The suffering has heightened as the government has stymied relief efforts.

1. Pray for peace and that relief shipments can get to the people. Pray that Christian relief agencies can get

Major Religious Sites: Omayyed Mosque, Chapel of St. Paul, Takieh es Sulaymanieh Mosque, Tomb of Sayyidah Zaynab

City Significance/History

On the road to Damascus Paul the apostle's life was forever changed by the power of Jesus. But people lived in the city many years before Paul's visit. Records unearthed in the city indicate that from the 3rd millennium bc to the present, the city has been inhabited.

Because of its location, the city has been conquered, destroyed, and rebuilt many times. Most of the ancient empires controlled the city during their apex. The religion of the city changed with almost every foreign power. The Arameans built a temple to their god, Hadad, the god of storms and rain. In the 3rd century, this same temple site was used to construct an enormous temple for the Roman god Jupiter, the god of war, lighting, and thunderbolts. With the rise of Christianity in the Roman Empire, the temple was converted into the Church of St. John the Baptist. It is believed his head is still at the site.

With Islam's arrival, the church was converted to a mosque, only later to be taken down and rebuilt into the largest mosque of its time (7th century). Two of the Omayyed Mosque's minarets are named the Minaret of the Bride and the Minaret of Jesus. Muslim tradition says that Jesus will appear at this location on the Judgment Day.

Prayer Points
1. Pray that the Orthodox and Catholic Christians would be born-again, active believers and witnesses.

2. Pray for laborers interested in serving among the new slums and unreached poor areas of the city.

3. Pray that the Muslim majority would receive godly wisdom from their Christian contacts and that the conversions out of Islam would increase. Pray for Christians to have boldness when given the opportunity to witness.

Calcutta (kal-cut-uh) Day 18

Status of the church: 163 congregations, only 45 Bengali-speaking

Major Religious Sites: Kali Temple, Sitambara Jain Temple, Tara Keshwar Temple Nakhoda Mosque St. Paul's Cathedral

City Significance/History A little over 300 years ago, Calcutta was just one of thousands of small villages in India. The British in the late 17th century settled here, and the village quickly grew into a city. Invasions by Indians made it necessary for the British to build a fort for protection. Calcutta became the capital and export center. William Carey pioneered a missionary movement here in 1793. The fall of the British caused great hardship in the city. Just to the east, East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) was established. Hindus moved west and Muslims moved east.

The slums of Calcutta have been made famous by the humble Mother Teresa. She and others, like the Buntains, have brought hope and life to the slums, but increased migration to the city keeps the slums growing

The local Bengali people have worshiped Kali. Seen as the Earth Mother-Creator, she also has an evil side Kali, translated "black," is the goddess of warfare, pestilence, blood sacrifice, and death. Calcutta, the city of Kali, translated "black," is the goddess of warfare, pestilence, blood sacrifice, and death. Calcutta, the city of Kali, lives up to its name. Many people come here to find a better life; most end up never finding it. Kali with her necklace of human heads claims another victim to death. Yet the masses of people still come. Calcutta is India's largest city-a city deep in bondage to its goddess.

Prayer Points

The slums are some of the worst in the world, and the city has the world's lowest urban living standard. Pray that the poor can live in dignity and find the food they need. For most the struggle for daily survival allows them no time for spiritual things.

2. The destructive god Kali is worshiped and appeased. Pray that God's power would be evident to the people living in bondage to Kali

3. Pray that the value of human life will be recognized, especially of females.

4. Pray for the Christian relief agencies, especially the hospitals and orphanages, that are ministering to the needy. Pray for strength and resources for the staff.

5. Pray for a Christian witness in the city's slums and among the unreached Muslims.

6. Pray for the students studying in the Bible colleges



Beijing (bay-jeeng) Day 23

Status of the church: Growing TSPM and underground churches (see Jinan for TSPM explanation)

Major Religious Sites: Fayuan Si Temple,

Niu Jie Muslim Temple. Guangii Temple, Mao Zedong Memorial Hall, Temple of Heaven

City Significance/History: Beijing's location on the edge of China's Northern Plain, made it a strategic military location for the control of China's north. Brutal invasions have marred Beijing throughout history.

India

Genghis Khan, coming down from Mongolia, slaughtered and destroyed the the city in the 13th century. From the rubble arose Khanbaliq, "Khan's Town." His grandson, Kublai Khan, ruled all of China, his capital being Khanbaliq. Corruption and fraud destroyed the Khan's reign, and the Ming Dynasty grew in its place.

The Forbidden City, the Temple of Heaven, and the Ming Tombs are lasting examples of the grandeur and exclusionist attitude of the Ming power base. Reigning from the 14th - 17th century, the Ming Dynasty fell apart, allowing the Qing Dynasty to take over China and set up their capital in Beijing, only later to become a victim of the Cultural Revolution (1911).

re defeated in World War II, Mao Zedong took power and started the People's Republic of China, turning all of China over to communism. Beijing grew, the old imperialism gave way to communism; with communism came roads, railways, one language, and universal education.

Prayer Points

1. From Beijing 1.2 billion people are governed. Pray for God's purposes to be worked through the government, especially when the communist "old guard" dies. Pray that officials favorable to Christianity will government, be raised up.

2. Pray for the safety of persecuted house church leaders who seek to minister for Christ in this tightly controlled environment. Pray that believers will have discernment about how and to whom they should share the gospel.

3. Pray that disillusioned university intellectuals in their search for truth would discover Christ, Also, pray for the effective follow-up and nurture of returned intellectuals who have become Christians while studying abroad

4. Many foreign business concerns are streaming into Beijing. Pray that Christians will wisely take advantage of these opportunities in a way that advances the kingdom

Status of the church: Little growth in the last 100 vears, a few Somali believers

Major Religious Sites: Fakr Al Din Mosque. Great Mosque

City Significance/History:

War-drought-devastation, the cycle of life for Saphia. She ran out of food-her two camels and goats died as the ground turned to dust. Eight months pregnant, she decided not to flee with her family to Ethopia. Instead, she moved to a refugee camp outside Mogadishu, where the streets became battle zones. Daily her husband sought food and work in the city.

Warlords send out war parties against other lords. One day, her husband was standing in a food line. A machine gun mounted on the back of a truck turned the corner and fired on the crowd-he died on the street.

Her baby, now a year old, survives only on what Saphia receives from the food handouts from the refugee workers. She has no choice-she is dependent on the food coming in. She dreams of the days when caring for the camels and goats, and which water hole to go to was the greatest concern. Now her little girl may never see the greatness of Somalia. War seems to be endless. Even if life-giving rain sweeps the land, the bullets will keep life short.

"Two things are needed- peace and rain"

Prayer Points

1. Pray that the warlords would lose their power and that the government would be stabilized.

2. Pray that the poor would receive the food and care they need.

3. Pray that the streets would be peaceful and safe, not battle zones.

4. Pray that the Christian relief workers can effectively communicate the love of Christ as they distribute food and medicine

5. Pray for the underground Somali church that is persecuted; many are unmarried men needing Christian

6. Pray for those men to be discipled into faithful and wise leaders in the young church-that they would learn to be warriors for Christ, bringing his peace

Istanbul (is-tan-bool) Day 11

City Significance/History

Istanbul's strategic location has been important since its beginning. Dorian Greeks led by Byzas started a fishing village here in 657 named Byzantium. The city was razed and rebuilt by the Romans in the 2nd century AD. Constantine captured the city in 324 and made Constantinopel the "New Rome." The Byzanties ruled their empire from here for the next 1000 years until the Muslim Ottoman Turks captured the city in 1453.

Istanbul is the only city to span two continents-Europe and Asia with the Bosphorus Strait separating the two. The strait is the gateway between the Mediterranean Sea and the Black Sea.

In 537, Justinian completed the Hagia Sophia-the largest and most beautiful church ever built, standing as a testimony to the Lord Jesus Christ. Like most of the churches in Turkey it was converted into a mosque. To promote religious harmony in the city, it is now a museum.

Istanbul continues to be a strategic city. Industry, commerce, and a major port enhance its importance. Being the largest city in Turkey it sets the pace for Westernization. Its population–already the largest in Turkey–is exploding through rural migration.

Praver Points

1. Pray that God would use the city's ancient roots as a religious and political capital to reach many throughout the Muslim world with the gospel.

Pray for unity and love among the local Turkish fellowships.

3. Pray that the economic crisis will cause Turks to think deeply about the emptiness of pursuing only material gain

4. Pray that the rise of the fundamentalist Muslim political party will cause nominal, secular Muslims to reconsider what Islam is and who they are.

5. Pray for the development of Christian radio and TV programming, and for the distribution of Christian videos, especially the Jesus film. Pray for more people to use the Bible correspondence course to learn about Jesus



Jaipur (ji-poor) Day 16

Meaning: "city of victory" Country: India, Rajasthan Province* Population: 1,969,000 Poverty: 108 slums Religi ous Breakdown: 89.% Hindu 7.5% Muslim 0.41% Christian 0.05% Evangelical

Status of the church: 26 churches, some 8000 Christians with half of south Indian origin

Major Religious Sites Iswari Minar Swarga Sul, Jantar Mantar Observatory

City Significance/History: Three ancient forts rest on the hills overlooking most of present-day Jaipur. Well water allowed this desert oasis to grow on a dried lake bed. The Amber Fort was the capital of the Mina tribe, who were the original inhabitants. The Jaigarh Fort, containing India's largest cannon, was so impregnable that no enemy breached its walls

In 1727, Maharaja Jai Singh II planned the expansion of the forts to one large fortified city. The city expanded and a wall was built around it with seven gates. At hight, the city gates were closed for protection. On the outside of the gates, long anti-elephant spikes were mounted to keep enemies from using their elephants to ram the gates

The color pink was said to be the color of hospitality. When Britain's Prince Albert visited the city in 1883, all the main buildings were painted pink to welcome him. As the provincial capital, Jaipur has continued to keep its traditional pink color

The wall has been torn down and used to build homes-the gates remain. The wall's foundation marks the old city, but Jaipur has expanded outside the old walls. Camels still pull carts down the street as Jaipur keeps its old and new moving together.

Prayer Points
1. Pray that the Muslim Meo people might become responsive to the gospel. Among the Muslim Meo people
are no known Christians.

2. The higher caste Hindus-the Rajputs, Jats, and Marwari-have shown little interest in the gospel. Pray that the spiritual powers keeping them in darkness will be broken.

3. Pray for increased conversions through literature distribution, radio evangelism, and Bible correspondence courses, and that the number of churches would multiply.

4. Worship of rats produces conditions that foster pneumonic plague. Pray that the idolatry underlying this health hazard would be bound

5. Most children in Rajasthan are married at age eight. Pray that laws abolishing child marriages would be obeved

Phnom Penh (nom pen) Day 27

Meaning: "the hill of a woman named Penh" Country: Cambodia (Kampuchea)* Population: 2,827,000 Poverty: War caused economic devastation Religious Breakdown: 87.0% Buddhist 7.8% Nonreligious/Atheist 2.7% Animist 0.38% Christian (mainly Catholic) 0.08% Evangelical

Status of the church: 30 congregations

Major Religious Sites: Wat Phnom, Silver Pagoda, Wat Qunalom Monastery. Nur ul-Ihsan Mosque, Independence Monument

City Significance/History

In the mid-15th century, the Khmer people were fighting the Thai, a long-standing enemy like the Vietnamese. The Thai captured the city of Angkor, causing the Khmer to relocate to Phnom Penh. Over 100 years earlier, Penh had found a Buddha in one of the three rivers that run through the area. She placed the Buddha on the highest hill as a holy pagoda

Battles with the Thai and Vietnamese continued, along with occupations by the Spanish and French. Catholic monks arrived with the Westerners.

Slowly the communist Khmer Rouge started to take over rural areas. By the 1960s they controlled provincial capitals, and in 1975 Phnom Penh fell into their hands. Being communist, they wanted to rid the country of all religion. Buddhist monks were killed, and of the estimated 10,000 Christians in Phnom Penh the vast majority were stabbed to death. The Khmer Rouge killed many people, including the educated, because they wanted to "purify" the Khmer people from outside influence.

The Vietnamese, because of border battles, sent troops into Phnom Penh. In 1979 the Khmer Rouge finally fell. The United Nations, in recent years, has tried to reestablish peace.

Prayer Points
1. Pray for unity among the local church leaders as well as the Christian leaders from other countries who work in Phnom Penh.

2. Pray for protection of the body of Christ from materialism, corruption, wrong doctrine, and competition.

3. Pray that God will raise up more Christian leaders to disciple the harvest that is pouring into the kingdom of God. Youth workers are needed particularly.

Pray that God will grant wisdom and finance to Christians who are willing to pioneer practical projects to rebuild the city and the lives of the people.

5. Many innocent people were tortured by the Khmer Rouge in prisons like Tuol Sleng. Pray for healing of the victims and forgiveness for former enemies.
